The Agamenticus area is the largest unfragmented coastal forest between Acadia National Park and the New Jersey Pine Barrens. You will see species that live nowhere else in Maine.

hard work

We will work on a project to protect forest and wetland habitat near Mount Agamenticus. We might build a bridge or reroute a trail around a wetland. Plan to dig in the dirt, cut branches and roots, move rocks and drive nails.

an undeveloped oasis in Southern Maine

More than 9000 acres of land in the area is protected from development here. At Mount Agamenticus, you can walk for hours in the forest without traffic.
